



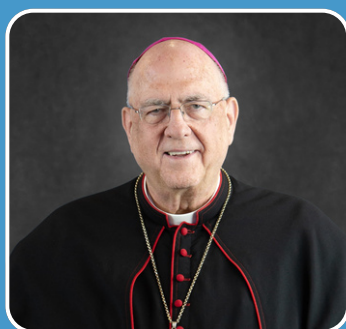

DAY 1: Friday, March 5, 2027

The Most Reverend

Joseph F. Naumann, Archbishop Emeritus of the Archdiocese of Kansas City in Kansas

Archbishop Emeritus Joseph F. Naumann was ordained a priest in 1975. He served as the Archdiocesan Pro-Life Coordinator from 1984 to 1995 and as Vicar General in the Archdiocese of St. Louis before being ordained as Auxiliary Bishop of St. Louis/Titular Bishop of Caput Cilla in 1997. He was appointed Administrator of the Archdiocese of St. Louis in 2003 and became the Archbishop for the Archdiocese of Kansas City in Kansas in 2005. On June 4th, 2024, Archbishop Naumann submitted his letter of resignation at the mandatory age of 75. On April 8, 2025, his resignation was accepted by Pope Francis. He became Archbishop Emeritus Joseph Naumann on May 27, 2025. He serves on the Clergy Board for the Sisters of Mary World Villages for Children.

Reverend Nicholas Ashmore

Fr. Nicholas Ashmore was ordained in 2019 in the Archdiocese of Kansas City, Kansas. He serves as pastor of Our Lady of Unity Catholic Parish and is pursuing a degree in Canon Law at The Catholic University of America. He holds a bachelor's degree in philosophy from Conception Seminary College and an S.T.B., M.Div., and M.A.Th. from Kenrick School of Theology.

Reverend Brian Schieber

Fr. Brian Schieber serves as Pastor of St. Michael the Archangel Catholic Parish in Leawood, Kansas. Ordained to the priesthood in 1999 following a career as a civil engineer, Father Schieber earned his engineering degree from the University of Kansas. Throughout his ministry in the Archdiocese of Kansas City in Kansas, he has served as a Parish Pastor, Vocations Director, and Director of Seminarians.
